

## **PASSENGERS AND CABIN BAGGAGE**

### **LIST OF PROHIBITED ARTICLES**

Without prejudice to applicable safety rules, passengers are not permitted to carry the following articles into security restricted areas and on board an aircraft:

- (a) guns, firearms and other devices that discharge projectiles — devices capable, or appearing capable, of being used to cause serious injury by discharging a projectile, including:
- firearms of all types, such as pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns,
  - toy guns, replicas and imitation firearms capable of being mistaken for real weapons,
  - component parts of firearms, excluding telescopic sights,
  - compressed air and CO<sub>2</sub> guns, such as pistols, pellet guns, rifles and ball bearing guns,
  - signal flare pistols and starter pistols,
  - bows, cross bows and arrows,
  - harpoon guns and spear guns,
  - slingshots and catapults;
- (b) stunning devices — devices designed specifically to stun or immobilise, including:
- devices for shocking, such as stun guns, tasers and stun batons,
  - animal stunners and animal killers,
  - disabling and incapacitating chemicals, gases and sprays, such as mace, pepper sprays, capsicum sprays, tear gas, acid sprays and animal repellent sprays;
- (c) objects with a sharp point or sharp edge — objects with a sharp point or sharp edge capable of being used to cause serious injury, including:
- items designed for chopping, such as axes, hatchets and cleavers,
  - ice axes and ice picks,
  - razor blades,
  - box cutters,
  - knives with blades of more than 6 cm, scissors with blades of more than 6 cm as measured from the fulcrum,
  - martial arts equipment with a sharp point or sharp edge,
  - swords and sabres;
- (d) workmen's tools — tools capable of being used either to cause serious injury or to threaten the safety of aircraft, including:
- crowbars,
  - drills and drill bits, including cordless portable power drills,
  - tools with a blade or a shaft of more than 6 cm capable of use as a weapon, such as screwdrivers and chisels,
  - saws, including cordless portable power saws,
  - blowtorches,
  - bolt guns and nail guns;
- (e) blunt instruments — objects capable of being used to cause serious injury when used to hit, including:
- baseball and softball bats,
  - clubs and batons, such as billy clubs, blackjacks and night sticks,
  - martial arts equipment;
- (f) explosives and incendiary substances and devices — explosives and incendiary substances and devices capable, or appearing capable, of being used to cause serious injury or to pose a threat to the safety of aircraft, including:
- ammunition,
  - blasting caps,
  - detonators and fuses,
  - replica or imitation explosive devices,
  - mines, grenades and other explosive military stores,
  - fireworks and other pyrotechnics,
  - smoke-generating canisters and smoke-generating cartridges,
  - dynamite, gunpowder and plastic explosives.

### **Liquids, aerosols and gels**

Before screening, liquids, aerosols and gels shall be removed from cabin baggage and shall be screened separately.

Where liquids, aerosols and gels have been removed from cabin baggage, the passenger shall present:

- (a) all liquids, aerosols and gels in individual containers with a capacity not greater than 100 millilitres or equivalent in one transparent re-sealable plastic bag of a capacity not exceeding 1 litre, whereby the contents of the plastic bag fit comfortably and the bag is completely closed; and
- (b) other liquids, aerosols and gels separately.

**Liquids, aerosols and gels may be exempted from screening if:**

- (a) in individual containers with a capacity not greater than 100 millilitres or equivalent in one transparent re-sealable plastic bag of a capacity not exceeding 1 litre, whereby the contents of the plastic bag fit comfortably and the bag is completely closed; or
- (b) to be used during the trip and is either required for medical purposes or a special dietary requirement, including baby food. When requested to do so the passenger shall provide proof of authenticity of the exempted liquid; or
- (c) obtained airside beyond the point where boarding passes are controlled from outlets that are subject to approved security procedures as part of the airport security programme, on condition that the liquid is packed in a bag that is both tamper evident and displays satisfactory proof of purchase at that airport on that day; or
- (d) obtained in the security restricted area from outlets that are subject to approved security procedures as part of the airport security programme; or
- (e) obtained at another Community airport, on condition that the liquid is packed in a bag that is both tamper evident and displays satisfactory proof of purchase at airside at that airport on that day; or
- (f) obtained on board an aircraft of a Community air carrier, on condition that the liquid is packed in a bag that is both tamper evident and displays satisfactory proof of purchase on board that aircraft on that day.
- (g) obtained at an airport situated in a third country listed in Attachment 4-D\*, on condition that the liquid, aerosol or gel is packed in a security tamper-evident bag inside which satisfactory proof of purchase at airside at that airport within the preceding 36 hours is displayed. The exemptions provided for in this point shall expire on 29 April 2011.'

\*All Norwegian, Icelandic, Swiss airports and international airports of the USA, Canada, Singapore Chang Airport, Malesia Kuala Lumpur International Airport and the following Kroatian airports: Dubrovnik, Rijeka, Pula, Split, Zadar and Zagreb.

**HOLD BAGGAGE (Checked baggage)**

**LIST OF PROHIBITED ARTICLES**

Passengers are not permitted to carry the following articles in their hold baggage: explosives and incendiary substances and devices — explosives and incendiary substances and devices capable of being used to cause serious injury or to pose a threat to the safety of aircraft, including:

- ammunition,
- blasting caps,
- detonators and fuses,
- mines, grenades and other explosive military stores,
- fireworks and other pyrotechnics,
- smoke-generating canisters and smoke-generating cartridges,
- dynamite, gunpowder and plastic explosives.

## **CARRIAGE OF AMMUNITION IN HOLD BAGGAGE (Checked-in baggage)**

A passenger may carry in his/her hold baggage ammunition for fire arms only if the ammunition in question has the UN number UN0012 or UN0014. The UN number is a four-digit number, which the United Nations Committee of Experts on the Transport of Dangerous Goods and on the Globally harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals has assigned to the substance or groups of substances for the purpose of identification. Ammunition containing explosive or incendiary projectiles may not be carried.

Ammunition for fire arms may be carried only for the passenger's own use. The maximum amount of ammunition to be carried shall not exceed a gross weight of 5 kg per person, and combining quantities among passengers is not allowed. The ammunition shall be tightly packed.

A passenger shall notify the air carrier of his/her intention to carry ammunition in his/her hold baggage at the time when the baggage is checked in.

The carriage of a sporting weapon and ammunition in a passenger's hold baggage is permitted. The air carrier shall be notified of the carriage of a weapon and ammunition at the time when the baggage is checked in. The weapon shall not be loaded and it shall be tightly packed. Ammunition for the sporting weapon shall not be carried in the same package as the weapon itself.
